Hazard Communication, AKA "Right To Know" is mandatory for any company doing business. It is also quite complicated and can be very time consuming. This presentation will orient attendees to the requirements, create an awareness to the necessary steps to achieve compliance, break down and simplify many of the steps and provide case studies and/or simulations.

Additional discussion points will include an orientation to material safety data sheets, product labeling, NFPA and HMIS labels and use of the NIOSH Pocket Guide to Chemical Hazards.
